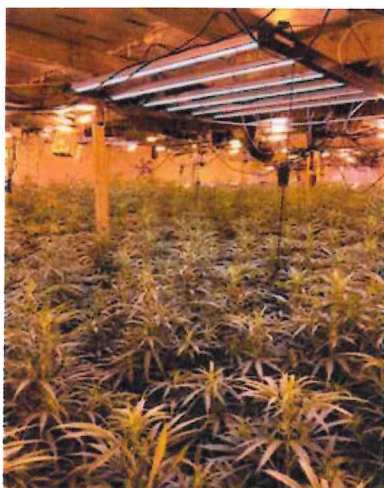
Like last year we are pleased to be able to report a small reduction in the volume of recorded crime in Tetbury.

Offences of violence cover a wide range of activity, from serious assaults to verbal threats, either in person or online. By far the largest contributor in this category is offences of common assault (32). We recorded one offence where GBH level injuries were inflicted and 11 ABH's.

There is a rise in Burglary offences with residential burglaries rising from 2 to 5. Theft and Criminal Damage offences had significant drops.

Policing activity and issues in Tetbury

- Last year we were able to introduce PC Callum Morley-Blackwell as the new Beat Manager for Tetbury. At that time Callum was also our NPT Beat Manager covering the villages south of Cirencester. In recent days a new PC has joined the team so Callum is now the Beat Manager for just the Tetbury community and surrounding villages, so no pressure Callum...
- In October PC Morley-Blackwell and PCSO Maina found and disrupted a cannabis factory within Tetbury Industrial Estate. Over 200 fairly mature plants were seized along with a large amount of growing equipment and a vehicle thought to belong to one of the suspects.



- On 15th December a 36 year old local man was charged with Possession of an Offensive Weapon in Tetbury. The offence took place back on 11th April when he was arrested having threatened several victims in the Tesco car park at about 10pm that night. The case was eventually resolved on 30th March at Cheltenham Magistrates Court where he received a Community Order, a fine and was ordered to pay court costs and compensation.
- On 13th December Sgt Gloyn, PC Morley-Blackwell and other officers arrested a 35 year old female from Tetbury following a proactive drugs search at a pub in Cirencester town centre. Cocaine valued at about £2000, around £1000 in cash and mobile phones were seized. The matter remains under investigation as the case has been referred to the CPS for a charging decision.
- In December PC Morley-Blackwell was working on an operation with colleagues in Cirencester when he identified a suspected drink driver. The suspicious vehicle, which had three passengers, failed to stop for Callum but specially trained officers were ready for it when it arrived in Tetbury where there was a short pursuit which officers ended with no-one sustaining injury. The 28 year old driver was arrested and charged with Drink Driving, Dangerous Driving and Failing to Stop for Police.



- Regular School Patrols have been carried out at St Marys and SWR Schools at the start and end of the school day. PCSO Ed Maina has given crime prevention and on-line safety talks at both schools and Ed also regularly visits the Tetbury youth club. We have recorded several low level assaults and threats of assaults between local children that have been dealt with through mediation and 'Out of Court Resolutions.'
- PCSO Maina has been working closely with Cottsway Housing association to address neighbour disputes. Not to damn any particular road but, three such examples all occurred in Hatters Close resulting in mediation between one pair of neighbours, a Restorative Justice report for a second dispute and one tenant being served with an Acceptable Behaviour Contract. PCSO Maina worked with Bromford Housing to resolve a similar dispute in Mercer Way with an ABC for anti-social behaviour.
- On 14th January other members of our NHPT arrested a 26 year old Wokingham man who was stopped at Priory Industrial Estate and found to be in possession of 22 small bags of class A drugs. The man was arrested for possession with intent to supply. On the same day he was charged with PWITS cocaine, driving without a licence and without insurance and detained for court the following day. The case has been sent to the Crown Court.
